SECTION II: INSTRUCTIONS TO PROSPECTIVE AGENCY

1. PERIOD OF ENGAGEMENT

The initial period of engagement with the shortlisted agencies shall be two (02) years. C-DAC, Chennai reserves the right to extend this period by another one/two years on same terms and conditions. More agencies can be added in the empanelled list, provided they meet the terms and conditions set out under this EoI.

2. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

All the prospective agencies must meet the minimum eligibility criteria given below.

- a. General Eligibility Criteria
 - i. Start-ups operating in niche technologies in India, recognized by DPIIT, possessing the necessary expertise in R&D or contract research, and registered under the Companies Act 2013 or under section 59 of Partnership Act 1932 or under the Limited Liability Partnership Act 2008, in India. Copy of Certificate of Incorporation/ Registration/ Partnership Deed or any other relevant document, as applicable, should be submitted along with a copy of address proof.
 - ii. The bidder should have a valid PAN and GST Registration (copy of PAN card and GST Registration Certificate should be submitted in the bid). In case GST Registration is not available, the bidder shall give undertaking that it will get registered before start of work, if work is awarded to them.
 - iii. Detailed technical profiles of the proprietor/ directors/ partners/key employees of the bidding firm, demonstrating their expertise and experience in the relevant domain, to establish the bidder's domain competency for participation in the EoI.
 - iv. Shareholding details of the promoters/partners/directors/mentors of the bidding start-up firm, accompanied by relevant supporting documents.
 - v. The bidder shall submit an undertaking on their letter-head stating that: "In reference to the Government of India, Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure, Office Memorandum No. F.No. 6/18/2019-PPD, Dated 23-07-2020. I hereby submit that, we have read the Clause regarding restrictions on procurement from a bidder of a country which shares a land border with India;



We are from such a country and have been registered with the competent authority. The copy of the valid registration certificate is enclosed. OR

We certify that we are not from such a country or the beneficial owner is not from such a country or we will not subcontract any work to a contractor from such countries.

- vi. Proof of PF registration to be submitted by the bidder, if the bidder comes under PF.
- vii. Bid by Consortium is not allowed.
- viii. The bidder should not be insolvent, in receivership, bankrupt or being wound up, not have had their business activities suspended and not be the subject of legal proceedings for any of the foregoing. An undertaking by the bidder should be submitted.
- ix. The bidder should not be blacklisted/debarred/banned/restricted by any Union Govt./State Govt. /PSU as on the date of submission of the Bid.

Note: The prospective agencies (Bidder) should provide sufficient documentary evidence to support the eligibility criteria. C-DAC Chennai reserves the right to reject any proposal not fulfilling the eligibility criteria

3. EARNEST MONEY DEPOSIT/BIS SECURITY (EMD)

The bidders shall sign a Bid Security Declaration (as per format given in EoI - Annexure E) accepting that if they withdraw or modify their bids during the period of validity etc., they will be suspended for the time specified in the EoI document.

Note: Bids received without Bid Security Declaration form shall be summarily rejected.

4. DESIRED CREDENTIALS

Over and above the eligibility criteria stipulated above, the additional credentials are desirable and will be given added weightage, as detailed in Section – II, S.No 8 "Evaluation of Proposals".

5. AMENDMENTS TO EOI DOCUMENT

At any time prior to the deadline for submission of proposals, C-DAC Chennai may, for any reason, whether on its own initiative or in response to the clarification request by a prospective agency, modify the EoI document. The amendments to the EoI



documents, if any, will be notified by release of corrigendum notice on https://eprocure.gov.in website. The amendments/ modifications will be binding on the prospective agencies. C-DAC Chennai at its discretion may extend the deadline for the submission of proposals if it thinks necessary to do so or if the proposal document undergoes changes during the submission period, in order to give prospective agencies time to take into consideration the amendments while preparing their proposals.

6. PREPARATION OF PROPOSALS

- a. Prospective agencies should avoid, as far as possible, corrections, overwriting, erasures or postscripts in the proposal documents. In case however, any corrections, overwriting, erasures or postscripts have to be made in the proposals, they should be supported by present date signatures of the same authorized person signing the proposal documents.
- b. Prospective agencies shall not be entitled to amend add/delete/correct the clauses mentioned in the entire tender document.

7. TECHNICAL PRESENTATION

Subsequent to submission of proposals, the Evaluation Committee of C-DAC Chennai may ask the eligible prospective agencies to give a detailed technical presentation, covering following points:

- a) Company Profile and nature of their activities.
- b) Knowledge, skills, expertise pertaining to the areas for which proposal is submitted (primary focus).
- c) Achievements, awards won, etc.
- d) Potential and priority areas for collaboration/indicative roles & responsibilities/plan/methodology for rendering the services for which the proposal is submitted.
- e) Capability and willingness.
- f) PoC Demonstration/ Product Demonstration.
- g) Any other differentiators.

8. EVALUATION OF PROPOSALS

- a. The proposals will be evaluated in two steps. The proposals will be examined based on eligibility criteria stipulated at Section II to identify the eligible agencies.
- b. The eligible agencies will be invited for the technical presentation, where they will be required to demonstrate their existing product (or) POC demonstration



- relevant to the specified business area or technology domain within 21 days timelines given by C-DAC.
- c. The eligible agencies may undertake a Proof of Concept (PoC) on NC-NC basis in the selective Domains/ Demonstration of existing products in the interested selective Domains. The problem statements for the same would be given to the eligible agencies and the PoC demonstration for the same need to be presented within 21 days timelines given by C-DAC.
- d. The shortlisting of the agencies will be finalized after technical presentation, PoC demonstration and evaluation/ Product Demonstration.
- e. The evaluation will be scored out of 100 marks, and a startup must obtain a minimum of 75 marks to qualify for empanelment in a particular domain.
- f. Each domain may have specific sub-criteria, but a common evaluation matrix can include:

9. C-DAC'S RIGHT TO AMEND/CANCEL

- a. C-DAC Chennai reserves the right to amend the eligibility criteria, scope of supply, technical specifications etc.
- b. C-DAC Chennai reserves the right to cancel the entire EoI without assigning any reasons thereof.

10. CORRUPT OR FRAUDULENT PRACTICES

- a. It is expected that the prospective agency who wishes to enrol as an agency should have the highest standards of ethics.
- b. C-DAC Chennai will reject the proposal if it encounters that the prospective agency recommended for award of contract has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices while competing for this contract.
- c. C-DAC Chennai may declare a prospective agency ineligible, either indefinitely or for a stated duration, to be awarded a contract if it at any time encounters



that the prospective agency has engaged in corrupt and fraudulent practices during the award/execution of contract.

11. PENALTY FOR USE OF UNDUE INFLUENCE

The prospective agency undertakes that he has not given, offered or promised to give, directly or indirectly, any gift, consideration, reward, commission, fees, brokerage or inducement to any person employed in C-DAC Chennai or otherwise in procuring the contract/agreement or forbearing to do or for having done or forborne to do any act in relation to the obtaining or execution of the contract/agreement or any other contract/agreement with the Government of India for showing or forbearing to show favour or disfavour to any person in relation to the contract/agreement or any other contract/agreement with the Government of India. Any breach of the aforesaid undertaking by the prospective agency or anyone employed by him or acting on his behalf (whether with or without the Knowledge of the prospective agency) or the commission of any offence by the prospective agency Partner or anyone employed by him or acting on his behalf, as defined in Chapter 9 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 or the Prevention of Corruption Act 1986 or any other Act enacted for the prevention of corruption shall entitle C-DAC Chennai to cancel the contract/agreement and all or other contract/agreements with the prospective agency and recover from the prospective agency the amount of any loss arising from such cancellation. The decision of C-DAC Chennai to the effect that a breach of the undertaking had been committed shall be final and binding on the prospective agency, giving or offering of any gift, bribe or inducement or any attempt at any such act behalf of the prospective agency toward any officer/employee of C-DAC Chennai or to any other person in a position to influence any officer/employee of C-DAC Chennai for showing any favour in relation to this or any other contract/agreement, shall render the prospective agency to such liability/penalty as C-DAC Chennai may deem proper, including but not limited to, termination of the contract/agreement, imposition of penal damages, and refund of the amount paid by C-DAC Chennai.

12. CONFIDENTIALITY

The agency and/or their personnel shall not, either during the term or after expiration of engagement period disclose any proprietary or confidential information relating to the services, contract or C-DAC's business or operations without the prior written consent of C-DAC Chennai. The agency and/or their personnel shall not, either during the term or after expiration of this contract, undertake any public communication, press/media releases relating to the services, contract, or C-DAC's business or operations without the written consent of C-DAC Chennai. Information available on public domain is excluded from confidentiality clauses.



13. FORCE MAJEURE

C-DAC Chennai may consider relaxing the penalty and delivery requirements, as specified in this document, if and to the extent that, the delay in performance or other failure to perform its obligations under the contract is the result of a Force Majeure. Force Majeure is defined as an event of effect that cannot reasonably be anticipated such as acts of God (like earthquakes, floods, storms etc.), acts of states/state agencies, the direct and indirect consequences of wars (declared or undeclared), hostilities, national emergencies, civil commotion and strikes at agency's premises or any other act beyond control of the agency.

14. ARBITRATION

In case any dispute arises between the C-DAC Chennai and successful agencies with respect to this EoI, including its interpretation, implementation or alleged material breach of any of its provisions both the Parties hereto shall endeavour to settle such dispute amicably. If the Parties fail to bring about an amicable settlement within a period of 30 (thirty) days, dispute shall be referred to the sole arbitrator mutually appointed by both parties. If the sole arbitrator is not appointed mutually by both the parties then the District Court Chennai shall have exclusive jurisdiction for appointment of sole arbitrator through court. Arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and Rules made there under, or any legislative amendment or modification made thereto. The venue of the arbitration shall be Chennai. The award given by the arbitrator shall be final and binding on the Parties. The language of arbitration shall be English. The common cost of the arbitration proceedings shall initially be borne equally by the Parties and finally by the Party against whom the award is passed. Any other costs or expenses incurred by a Party in relation to the arbitration proceedings shall ultimately be borne by the Party as the arbitrator may decide. Courts in Chennai only shall have the exclusive jurisdiction to try, entertain and decide the matters which are not covered under the Arbitration and conciliation Act.

15. INDEMNITY

Selected agencies may please note that, C-DAC Chennai shall neither be the Employer of nor shall it be deemed to be the principal employer of any persons to be deployed by the agencies towards the service rendered and shall not in any manner be responsible for any act, omission or commissions by the agencies, the manpower deployed for this project or by his employees, in respect of any non-compliance of all or any labour and other laws statutory notifications, relevant rules and regulations applicable to the provision of Provident Fund and ESIC of the persons engaged by the supplier and no claim in the respect shall lie against C-DAC Chennai.



The agencies shall keep indemnified C-DAC Chennai for any such claim raised by employees of the agencies. It may be expressly understood that the relationship between the parties hereto is as Principal to Principal and the agencies shall not be an agent of C-DAC Chennai for any purpose whatsoever, and shall not represent or hold himself out as such to any person/s.

16. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- a. The maximum aggregate liability of selected agencies in respect of following cases shall not exceed the total amount of the Contract/ Works Order:
 - i. Any claims, losses, costs or damages arising out of or in connection with the Contract/ Works Order or SoW.
 - ii. Damage(s) occasioned by agencies for breach of Confidentiality Obligations.
 - iii. Regulatory or statutory fines imposed by a Government or Regulatory agencies for non-compliance of statutory or regulatory guidelines, Rules, Regulations etc., were brought to the notice of agencies.
- b. The liabilities- if any with respect to the following shall be at actuals:
 - i. Claims that are the subject of indemnification pursuant to infringement by the agencies of third party Intellectual Property Right
 - ii. Damage(s) occasioned by the Gross Negligence or Willful Misconduct of the agencies.
- c. Under no circumstances shall either Party be liable for any indirect, consequential or incidental losses, damages or claims including loss of profit, loss of business or revenue.

17. TERMINATION

Validity of order/contract will remain till fulfilment of all obligations pertaining to development and successful deployment of software including (but not limited to) the terms and conditions stipulated in the order, for the period stipulated in the Order. C-DAC Chennai reserves the right to terminate the contract/cancel order with or without cause/reason by giving 60 days' notice to the selected agencies. The selected agencies may terminate the Service Agreement /Order by at least 30 days written notice, in the event of non-payment of undisputed invoices for 60 days from the due date. All amounts which are due and payable to the Vendor shall immediately be paid by C-DAC Chennai in the event of termination of the agreement for any reason whatsoever.

18. RESTRICTIONS ON ASSIGNMENT, DELEGATION, AND SUBCONTRACTING

Selected agencies shall not assign, delegate or otherwise deal with any of its rights or obligations under this contract without prior written permission of C-DAC Chennai.



The prime responsibility towards the successful execution of agreement/contract lies with prospective agencies associating with C-DAC Chennai. The selected agency shall not fully or partially sub-let to any other entity without prior approval and written consent of C-DAC Chennai.

19. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this contract is determined to be invalid or unenforceable, it will be deemed to be modified to the minimum extent necessary to be valid and enforceable. If it cannot be so modified, it will be deleted and the deletion will not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision.

20. INTERPRETATION OF THE CLAUSES IN THE EOI DOCUMENT

In case of any ambiguity/dispute in the interpretation of any of the clauses in the Eol document, the interpretation of the clauses by Director General, C-DAC shall be final and binding on all parties.

21. JURISDICTION

The courts at Chennai, Tamil Nadu alone will have the jurisdiction to try any matter, dispute or reference between parties arising out of this Eol/Empanelment Agreement. It is specifically agreed that no court outside and other than Chennai, Tamil Nadu Court shall have jurisdiction in the matter.

22. AGREEMENT WITH OTHER ORGANIZATION

The Bidder shall neither associate the name of C-DAC with any third party nor permit the utilization of any services of C-DAC by any such party. Any breach of this condition shall constitute a material violation of this EoI Agreement, and notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, this EoI Agreement shall stand terminated ipso facto upon such breach.

23. NON-DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION

The bidder shall not communicate or use in advertising, publicity, sales releases or in any other medium any information/materials like description of the site, dimensions, photographs or any other information concerning the work under this EoI which may come to its possession, without the prior written permission of the C-DAC.

24. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS (IPR)

All intellectual property rights (IPR) arising out of any work carried out by the bidder in connection with this EoI shall be the sole and exclusive property of C-DAC, unless otherwise agreed in writing by C-DAC.



The bidder shall not use or disclose any intellectual property, proprietary information, data, reports, or materials belonging to C-DAC for any purpose other than as expressly permitted under the terms of this EoI.

Any pre-existing intellectual property of the bidder that is used in the course of providing deliverables under this EoI shall remain the property of the bidder; however, the bidder shall grant to C-DAC a non-exclusive, irrevocable, royalty-free, and worldwide license to use, reproduce, and modify such pre-existing IPR solely for the purposes of the project.

The bidder shall indemnify and hold harmless C-DAC from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, liabilities, costs, and expenses (including legal fees) arising from or in connection with any infringement or alleged infringement of any third-party IPR by the bidder during the execution of the project.

25. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

a. Definition of Conflict of Interest A Conflict of Interest arises when an entity or individual has competing interests or loyalties that could potentially influence or appear to influence the impartiality or objectivity of their involvement in the EoI process, evaluation, or execution of collaborative activities.

b. Obligations of Applicants

- Applicants shall disclose any actual or potential conflict of interest at the time of submission of their EoI response.
- ii. A conflict of interest may include, but is not limited to:
 - 1. A relationship (personal, professional, or financial) with C-DAC personnel or evaluation committee members;
 - 2. Involvement in activities or business interests that may affect or appear to affect the fairness of the selection process;
 - 3. Participation in preparation or formulation of the EoI or related documentation;
 - 4. Ownership or beneficial interest in competing entities submitting responses to this EoI.

Declaration Requirement
 Each applicant must submit a signed declaration stating that no conflict of interest exists or disclosing any actual or potential conflict of interest.

- d. Right to Disqualify or Terminate C-DAC reserves the right to disqualify any applicant found to have a conflict of interest that, in its opinion, compromises the integrity of the EoI process. If a conflict of interest is discovered after empanelment, C-DAC may terminate the engagement or take appropriate remedial action.
- e. **Ongoing**The obligation to disclose conflicts of interest is ongoing. If a conflict arises



during the course of the engagement, the empanelled entity must promptly notify C-DAC in writing.

26. ARBITRATION

In the event of a dispute or a difference of any nature whatsoever between the parties during the course of performance of respective obligations arising out of this Eol Agreement, the parties agree to refer the matter to their respective Heads of the organization to resolve the disputes keeping in view the best interest of the Parties and with the spirit of performance of this Agreement. If the matter still remains unresolved, dispute shall be referred to the sole arbitrator appointed by the C-DAC. Arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and Rules made there under, or any legislative amendment or modification made thereto. The venue of arbitration shall be Chennai.

SECTION III: SCOPE OF SERVICES AND ROLES

1. MODES OF ENGAGEMENT

Selected agencies shall collaborate, develop, implement, test, maintain and support the solutions in the following Next-Gen Operating Systems, Cyber Security, Cloud, IoT & Embedded Systems, Neuromorphic, LiFi, UAV, AUV, Green Communication Technologies, Digital Twin, Quantum, Industry 4.0, HPC, ERP, AI/ML, Strategic Electronics Including VLSI and Embedded Systems. The solution may also encompass software/hardware products in the identified domains and associated areas. It is envisaged to have end to end collaboration from development to release processes including deployment automation, scalable, seamless deployment and operations. The systems so developed should be effectively tested, modular and robust. As per project demands, such agencies should be ready to provision, design, develop and deploy the hardware /software products, project management & planning. The proposed modes of engagement, not limited to, are as follows.

- a. Collaborative R&D Partner (CRDP):
 - Empanelled startups may propose to engage with C-DAC(C) on R&D projects.
 - ii. Empanelled startups have to submit detailed proposals, covering clear deliverables, timelines, roles, resource requirements, and funding responsibilities in advance.
 - iii. C-DAC(C) may consider involving the empanelled startup for joint proposal submission to ministry on case to case basis
 - iv. Any IPR generated shall be governed by C-DAC/funding ministry. Decisions on joint ownership or specific licensing agreements will be decided on a case to case basis as approved by the funding agency.

b. Co-development Partner (CDP):

- i. Empanelled startups may propose co-development of solutions in the specified domains, either independently or with system integrators.
- ii. The startup shall submit a detailed proposal including problem statement, innovation roadmap, resource plan, and commercialization strategy.
- iii. Empanelled startups have to invest a predetermined percentage of the total project cost (usually between 10% to 50% depending on case to case basis) for co-development. The joint proposal shall be submitted by C-DAC(C) to ministry (MeitY, DST, MoES, DoT, etc) funding along with investment from Startups



- iv. Any IPR generated shall be governed by C-DAC/funding ministry. Decisions on joint ownership or specific licensing agreements will be decided on a case to case basis as approved by the funding agency.
- v. Startups have to commercialize on the product generated and royalty has to be given to C-DAC(C)
- vi. C-DAC(C) may onboard multiple startups in each domain depending on the uniqueness and applicability of their proposed solutions.
- vii. A Separate IOA will be submitted by the Startup
- c. Existing / New Client (Government/Private)Projects
 - i. C-DAC(C) may engage the empanelled startups for joint development of existing or any new client projects
 - ii. The startup must ensure timely delivery of assigned tasks
 - iii. Any IPR generated shall be governed by C-DAC(C). Decisions on joint ownership or specific licensing agreements will be decided on a case to case basis as approved by the funding agency.

In either of the modes, the selected agency should complete the development and/or implementation and/or maintenance of applications and/or modules as per the scope and milestones stated in Statement of Work. The selected agency will be responsible for the successful outcome as per the acceptance criteria and milestones defined in SoW. The scope of services to be provided by the agency may also cover services for the identified domains and associated areas for maintenance and support of the existing equipment/software/application, design, development, installation, integration and configuration of additional features and functionalities.

2. SCOPE OF ENGAGEMENT

The identified domains are listed below, but are not limited to:

- Next-Gen Operating Systems: Development of new-age, secure, indigenous operating systems for general and specialized applications. Development of operating systems modules tailored for various domains and devices.
- Cyber Security: Securing India's digital infrastructure with cutting-edge tools, algorithms, applications and frameworks for product/solutions.
- Cloud: A fully indigenous cloud stack for computing, storage, network, and orchestration. Development of different modules as part of the cloud stack
- **IoT:** Development of secure, intelligent, scalable, and indigenous IoT platforms, devices, and edge computing modules for diverse applications.
- **Neuromorphic:** Design and development of neuromorphic computing systems inspired by human brain architecture for ultra-low-power Al applications
- **LiFi:** Indigenous development of LiFi modules for indoor, outdoor and underwater communications



- **UAV:** Design and development of drone hardware & firmware for military operations, surveillance, and civilian applications.
- Autonomous Underwater Vehicles (AUV): Design and development of hardware and firmware of AUV for marine communications
- Digital Twin: Creation of real-time digital twin frameworks and platforms for simulation, monitoring, and analytics across sectors
- Quantum: Quantum modules across all verticals, including processors, communication, sensing, algorithms, applications, operating systems, simulations and cloud.
- Industry 4.0: Development of intelligent and automated solutions integrating cyber-physical systems, IIoT, smart manufacturing technologies, Blockchain and Robotics.
- HPC: Develop operating system modules, software tools, & applications in HPC.
- ERP: Develop the modules for the ERP Solutions.
- AI/ML: Indigenous development of AI/ML models, frameworks, and applications for cross-domain problem-solving and decision support including image/video analytics
- Strategic Electronics Including VLSI and Embedded Systems
- Next-Generation Communication Technologies: Intent to partner with C-DAC in co-developing secure, scalable, and mission-critical SDR platforms
- Next-Gen Educational Solutions: Integrate cutting-edge technologies into learning environments - driving innovation from classroom to career. Turnkey systems designed to foster engagement, encourage experimentation, and promote excellence by embedding Artificial Intelligence, Robotics, and realworld applications directly into the educational ecosystem.

3. INDICATIVE DELIVERABLES THROUGH ENGAGEMENT WITH SHORTLISTED AGENCIES

The following is a list of indicative deliverables proposed through engaging with agencies shortlisted through this EoI. However actual deliverables will depend upon project specific requirements and will be mutually finalized by C-DAC Chennai and selected agencies, before placing of order:

- a. Design /develop system/hardware/software
- b. High Level and Low-Level Design/ Architecture Document
- c. Specification (SRS)
- d. User Manual/Statement of Work (SoW)
- e. Technical Manual/know-how/design artifacts/components
- f. Data Backup/Archival Process



- g. Requirement Traceability Matrix
- h. Source Code with documentation

4. ENGAGEMENT PROCESS WITH SHORTLISTED AGENCIES

C-DAC Chennai intends to engage with the shortlisted agencies and the indicative terms and conditions applicable for such an engagement - but not limited to, will be as follows:

- a) The contract/agreement shall depend upon the project duration and may initially go up to a period of 02 (two) years. C-DAC may extend the initial contract/agreement by another 01/02 (one/two) years.
- b) C-DAC will publish the complete scope of work on the GeM portal either during or after the proposal submission phase, exclusively among the selected startups under this subject EoI. C-DAC reserves the right to issue the order to either a single startup or multiple startups, depending on who matches the L1 price, if required. C-DAC retains full discretion in deciding whether to award single or multiple orders.
- c) The successful prospective agency will be required to submit the performance bank guarantee (3-10% of order value) for future project specific work orders through tender as applicable.
- d) The contract will be awarded to the eligible agency offering the most competitive prices and meeting the technical criteria.
- e) The value of individual order/contract may vary from project to project, depending upon the type of engagement as mentioned in "Objectives" section, nature and complexity of the project.
- f) The detailed scope of services, terms and conditions of work shall be stipulated in 'SoW' (Statement of Work) to be signed by both the parties before release of individual order.
- g) The contract may include terms related to penalty for delay in meeting the deadlines.
- h) The contract may include terms related to penalty for non/short performance.
- i) The contract may include terms related to Change order procedure for variation in scope of services or changes in requirements.
- j) The contract may include terms related to taxes and tax/duty exemptions.

Note: In case a sufficient number of partners are not empanelled for a specific domain, C-DAC shall have the option to again refloat the subject EoI to empanel more partners in addition to existing. Accordingly, all partners empanelled under the current EoI, as well as those empanelled through any subsequent EoI, if any, will be considered for business engagement as outlined above.



5. OBLIGATIONS OF THE AGENCIES

- a. Standard of Performance: The agencies shall perform the Services and carry out their obligations hereunder with all due diligence, efficiency, in accordance with generally accepted professional standards and practices, and shall observe sound management practices, and employ appropriate technology and safe and effective equipment, machinery, materials and methods. The agencies shall always act, in respect of any matter relating to this engagement or to the Services, as faithful advisers to C-DAC Chennai, and shall at all times support and safeguard C-DACs legitimate interests in any dealings with third Parties.
- b. Prohibition of Conflicting Activities: The agencies shall not engage and not allow their personnel to engage, either directly or indirectly, in any business or professional activities which would conflict with the activities assigned to them under this contract.
 - i. The agencies shall keep safe, secure, confidential and protect from unauthorized access, loss or damage all demographic information, and all documents, data and information of any nature provided to the agencies for the discharge of services.
 - ii. The agencies shall not store, copy, publish, print, interfere, tamper with or manipulate the information/data received from C-DAC Chennai, other than that required for discharge of services.
 - iii. The agencies shall not give access to the information or data collected and received from C-DAC Chennai in the course of discharge of services, to any person who is not authorized to handle the information or data. Information should only be given to authorized personnel and only used in the manner prescribed by C-DAC Chennai.
- c. General Confidentiality: Except with the prior written consent of C-DAC Chennai, the agencies and the Personnel shall not at any time communicate to any person or entity any confidential information acquired, stored and received from C-DAC Chennai in the course of the Services, nor shall the agencies and the Personnel make public the recommendations formulated in the course of, or as a result of, the Services.

d. Accounting, Inspection and Auditing

- i. The agencies
 - shall keep accurate and systematic accounts and records in respect of the Services hereunder, in accordance with internationally accepted accounting principles and in such form and detail as will clearly identify all relevant time changes and costs, and the bases thereof, and



- shall periodically permit C-DAC Chennai or its designated representative and/or C-DAC, and upto five years from expiration or termination of this contract, to inspect the same and make copies thereof as well as to have them audited by auditors appointed by C-DAC Chennai or C-DAC itself as the case may be.
- ii. C-DAC Chennai shall have the right to carry out inspection checks, audits of the agency's premises and/ or locations, facilities, or point of delivery of services performed under this contract.
- iii. C-DAC Chennai shall have the right to carry out scheduled/ unscheduled visits to any of the locations, premises & facilities and oversee the processes and operations of the agencies.
- e. **Sub- contracting:** The agencies shall not be permitted to subcontract any part of its obligations, duties, or responsibilities under this contract without the prior written approval of C-DAC Chennai.
- f. **Reporting Obligations:** As per terms and conditions mutually agreed at the time of award of work.
- g. **Rights of Use:** All rights of use of any process, product, service, or data developed, generated, or collected, received from C-DAC Chennai or any other task performed by the agencies under the execution of projects awarded under this contract, would lie exclusively with C-DAC or its nominated agencies in perpetuity free from all liens, encumbrances, and other third party rights and the agencies shall, wherever required, take all steps that may be necessary to ensure the transfer of such rights in favour of C-DAC or its nominated agencies.

h. Safety & Security of Data, Premises, Location/site

- i. The Data, information, documents provided by C-DAC Chennai to the agencies is the property of C-DAC Chennai. The agencies shall display due diligence in the handling of the said data and be responsible for the Data, thus provided.
- ii. The agencies shall not use the information, the name or the logo of C-DAC and or Government of India without authorization of C-DAC Chennai.
- iii. The agencies shall not use and/or transmit any information, data, layouts, designs, diagrams, storage media (hard disk/tapes) or any other goods/material in physical or electronic form, which are proprietary to or owned by C-DAC, without prior written permission from the C-DAC.
- iv. The agencies shall follow the Security Guidelines issued by C-DAC Chennai.



- v. The agencies would be governed by the provisions of the Law of the Land, including but not limited to the IT Act and other relevant Acts.
- vi. C-DAC reserves the right to carry out third party Audits of the agencies to ensure compliance of stated and implicit requirements.
- vii. The rogue behavior of the employees of agencies shall fall under the 'Unlimited liability' to the agencies.
- i. Equipment & Materials Provided by the agencies: Equipment or materials brought by the agencies and the Personnel and used either for the Project or personal use shall remain the property of the agencies or the Personnel concerned, as applicable.
